Program: Using Keywords to Enhance Reading a Chart

Sun & Moon

The Sun entered the sign of Aquarius on January 21, the sign of the individual in relation to the social fabric. Where is this energy being highlighted this month in your chart?

The New Moon was on January 23rd at 2 degrees, 42 minutes of Aquarius, the sign of the individual as a part of a social group. This month you may feel the necessity of paying attention to the groups in your life, and your part in them. Or conversely, you may feel a desire to rebel against the confines of a social group.

Marc Edmund Jones' Sabian Symbol for 3 degrees of Aquarius is *A deserter from the navy*. This is the symbol of human rebellion taken to the extreme. It implies a demand for a more rewarding expression of one's individuality, and the courage to be true to yourself first, then to the group, but only as it reflects your values.

The Full Moon occurs February 7th at 18 degrees, 32 minutes of Leo, the sign of personal expression and creativity.
